Event Catalyst Profile

Agent Cumulonimbus "Nimbus" "Nim" Doe

Agent Doe claims to have stumbled upon Bureau recruitment accidentally. Upon questioning from the most senior agent present, Doe requested hamburgers. Upon further questioning, Doe chose to join as a probationary agent with the strictest possible confidentiality clause. It was not until after all paperwork was signed that their status as a Catalyst was realized. Extensive tests were performed to confirm this, including several posing as aptitude tests, which Doe complained about taking repeatedly. Results can be found in File ROC9E5, confirming that they are indeed an Event Catalyst, and no further confirmation is required at this time, *Jeremy*.

During training, Doe has displayed a tendency to react spontaneously and recklessly if someone appears to be in trouble. It is unclear if this is part of an elaborate act, but putting bystanders in apparent danger is a potential strategy in case of confrontation. Agents are advised to do so from a distance, and to obscure their own involvement if possible, as Doe may seek retribution on whomever they see as responsible. They also demonstrated notable physical strength while remaining within plausible human levels, explaining that they are "really so good at lacrosse and carrying boxes." It is once again unclear if this is an act; refer to File ROC9E5 for comparison charts and theories.

In a session with a Resource Specialist at the end of their probationary term, Doe related a possible Extranormal Encounter from a camping trip. They informed the Specialist that a terrifying crooked shadow spoke with their mother's voice; they then insisted that this was a strange dream, possibly brought on by eating too much before bed. Further analysis is required to determine whether they truly believe this, whether this story was a ploy to gain sympathy from Bureau agents, and whether this incident impacted their status as a Catalyst.

After their probationary period and at the request of Event Specialists, Doe was accepted as a full-time agent and assigned to Field Team Delta 7, assignment: Reddington. They responded to this assignment by saying they were "happy to be here."

Doe is personable and seems to enjoy talking to people, both Bureau personnel and outsiders; this is useful in a field research agent, but concerning in an Event Catalyst. Agents are advised to monitor Doe's interactions with unknown individuals and to be cautious during their own interactions with Doe; refer to File ROC9E5 for a list of all suspicious but unclear statements Doe has made to Bureau agents.

Threat Level Classification: **Outlier**. Doe has successfully hidden the magnitude of their power and knowledge of the Event, even from the Bureau's rigorous testing. Agents are advised to consider them incredibly dangerous and to record and report any information immediately.
